Dear Parents and Carers,

The weather has been lovely over the last couple of weeks please can I remind you to provide a hat and a drink/water bottle for your child every day so that they are kept safe in the heat and the sun. If possible please apply sunscreen before school to keep them safe too.

Our current attendance is 95.4% which is above national expectations. Attendance is now reported on an online platform directly to the government (DFE). This is monitored by myself, Plymouth CAST and the local authority Educational Welfare Officer. Unfortunately I have had lots of absence requests for holidays which I am unable to authorise; if we feel that a child's attendance is below the expected expectation of 90% we will send you a letter asking for improvements to be made. Our school policy reflects the DFE (governments) expectations and clearly sets out the next steps. We are here to support you with improving your child's attendance in school, please do let us know if we can help.

Please can I remind you all to send the waiver in for the Rainbow run on Monday afternoon so the children can take place. If some children do not want to have the paint experience, we will be encouraging them to take part with out paint, so please do not worry.














Today the children honoured the life of Jozef Stasiak, and took part in a fun Rainbow X Day.

THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 18th June 2023



When Jesus saw the crowds he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. He said to his twelve disciples, "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers

to his harvest." He then gave them authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and to cure all kinds of diseases and sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James the, son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, the one who was to betray him. These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them as follows: "Go to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge."

Age Restrictions for Social Media Platforms

Do you know what your child is doing online? Are you routinely talking to your child and checking what internet sites they are accessing?

It is very important to monitor and teach your child some key internet safety rules...

- Don't post any personal information online – like your address, email address or mobile number.
- Think carefully before posting pictures or videos of yourself. Once you've put a

picture of yourself online most people can see it— is it a photo you would want everyone to see?

- Keep your privacy settings as high as possible.
- Never give out your passwords

(except to your parents if they want to check your accounts to keep you safe).

- 5) Don't befriend people you don't know.
- 6) Don't meet up with people you've met online. Speak to your parent or carer about people suggesting you do.
- 7) Remember that not everyone online is

who they say they are—adults sometimes pretend to be children to make friends with you online.

- 8) Think carefully about what you say before you post something online.
- Respect other people's views, even if you don't agree with someone else's views doesn't mean you need to be rude.
- Use parental safety software/apps to block inappropriate internet use and monitor your children's online activity.



- 11) Ensure that the online games your child wants to play are appropriate to their age.
- 12) If you see something online that If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or worried: leave the website and tell a trusted adult immediately.
