

had a great start back to school and the children have settled straight back into their learning and are working extremely hard.

Each class has started an exciting new topic this term. Look out in this newsletter for the information about Knowledge Organisers', which will give you an insight into what your child is learning about in this term's topic.

Today we were visited by Emily, from Falmouth Marine School, who gave a talk to the whole school about the ocean. The children learnt some fascinating facts about sea creatures and the effects of plastic and climate change on the ocean. Class 6 then enjoyed a session with Emily focusing more on some of the issues affecting our oceans, such as overfishing and invasive species. The children showed great enthusiasm for their learning, asking very thoughtful questions.

Some of the teaching assistants are working with a different class this term. Just so you are aware of the changes:
