4th Sunday of Advent - A reflection by Mgr. Robert Draper

Looking forward - the time is now

Mic 5:1-4 Ps 79 Heb 10:5-10 Lk 1:39-44

It is striking the way in which Luke depicts the scene of today's gospel. The greatest moment of all history – the reality of the Incarnation – God becoming human – is perceived by just three figures: an elderly woman whose childlessness means she is despised, a young woman who is pregnant without the involvement of her betrothed and a child in the womb. Luke is always known as the gospel for the poor and marginalised – but the way he has carefully crafted the scene in which humankind receives the knowledge of the advent of the saviour is breath-taking.

Luke will give us a list of the all the powerful (male) key players in Palestine at the beginning of chapters 2 and 3 of his gospel, but here where the reality of God's action is announced we have only "insignificant" people aware. That should not surprise anyone familiar with the scriptures; "And you Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the



clans of Judah" – it is those who are least who have ready access to the ways of God. All the rest of the infancy narratives confirm this – as does the whole gospel story as it unfolds – and that is what all disciples need to keep hold of as they seek to live their lives in conformity to the values of the kingdom.
