I do hope you are all safe and well. In the last few days, myself and others have been giving some thought to our Christmas celebrations. First some good news; without compromising on the required social distancing we have managed to increase the capacity of the St Mary's, Falmouth from 40 to 60, at the moment the capacity at Mawnan Smith remains at 30. To remind you our planned Christmas Masses are as follows:

December 24th – 6 pm at Mawnan Smith and 9 pm at Falmouth

December 25th – 10.30 am at Falmouth.

In the coming week there will be forms available for you to complete with your choice of Mass, you will also be asked to give an alternative date/time just in case your first choice is full. To make the most of the seating capacity you will be allocated a named place in the church. You will also be able to seek a place through the phone by calling the parish office. I do hope that these plans will enable as many people as possible to attend the Christmas Masses.

Unfortunately, our usual crib inside the church will not be possible this year. However, a much smaller crib will be in place on the sanctuary.

Our Christmas celebrations will be very different this year but the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ will still be celebrated with great joy and thanksgiving.

World Food Day

A short excerpt from a message sent by Pope Francis

Pope Francis sends a message to the Director General of the UN's Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO) on World Food Day, and thanks the UN organisation for their work to eradicate the tragedy that is human hunger. (The Nobel Peace Prize was recently awarded to the UN's World Food Programme.

In his message, Pope Francis said hunger is caused, "to a large extent, by an unequal distribution of the fruits of the earth, in addition to the lack of investment in agriculture, the consequences of climate change and the increase in conflicts in different parts of the planet, as well as by the tonnes of food that are discarded". Faced with this reality, he continued, "we cannot remain insensitive or paralysed" because "we are all responsible." The Pope underlined "the urgent need for everyone to act together so as to 'promote hope' in all people." Pope Francis went on to note that the current crisis shows us that we need concrete policies and actions to eradicate hunger in the world.
