Free School Meals

Dear Parents/Guardians

Changes to free school meal eligibility under Universal Credit

The eligibility criteria for free school meals have been changed. This letter explains the changes and how they might affect you.

What are the new eligibility criteria?

Children are entitled to receive free school meals if they or their parents or guardians receive any of the benefits below.

 \cdot Universal Credit, provided they have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit

• Child Tax Credit, provided they are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by HMRC

 \cdot Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

I don't currently claim free school meals - what does this mean for me?

If you think you might be eligible for free school meals, submit a claim to your school or local authority. Your school should have a form you can use. The information you provide will be used to check if you are in receipt of a qualifying benefit and, if you are on Universal Credit, that your earnings do not exceed the threshold. If you claim Universal Credit, your earnings will be assessed from up to three of your last Universal Credit assessment periods.

If you are eligible, your school will be notified. Your child will receive free school meals and the school will receive extra funding.

I am currently claiming free school meals - what does this mean for me?

Most people won't be affected by the new criteria. If you're currently claiming free school meals, but don't' meet the new criteria, your child will continue to receive free school meals until the end of the Universal Credit rollout period. This will apply even if your earnings rise above the new threshold or if you stop being entitled to Universal Credit. The rollout period is currently scheduled to end in March 2022.

Once Universal Credit is fully rolled out, your child will keep their free school meal until the end of their current phase of education, i.e. primary or secondary.

Breakfast Club

Some good news as we have found a way of re-introducing the Breakfast Club. Details are as follows;-

Children can arrive from 8:00am. Breakfast will be served in the hall with a selection of cereals, followed by toast and various spreads. Fruit and yogurt will also be available. Drinks on offer will be milk, squash or water. If requested, hot drinks can be provided. If your child has any allergies please let the kitchen know.

Mrs Alway supervises the group and activities after breakfast will include colouring, drawing, reading and board games to begin with.

The cost is £2.50 per session, but we are hoping to reduce this if numbers increase. This is not a profit making scheme and the school only wishes to cover the cost of staffing and the food. Please use Parent Pay to make your payment. If you are entitled to childcare help, you can claim back some of the cost through tax credit awards. Contact HMRC for further details.

AR STORYCUBES PROJECT This is a fairly extensive project and I've tried to keep the description as brief as possible, but at the same time [...]

Throughout his visit, he constantly reported that the pupils here at St Mary's excelled and their teacher's expectations of them were exceptionally high. He was introducing work for example using AR Storycubes which would normally have been introduced to older students. Joe said, "The project took around 10 hours to produce finished cubes. The students worked intensively on these over a day and half during one of my training visits, (I've been working with the school for about three years now). For me one of the key points of the project is that many skills and concepts can be covered and the students are exploring the possibilities of integrated workflows and how the iPad offers increased opportunities for learning through these combined workflows. Also, the students are learning many transferable skills and have learned and developed an extensive workflow that is not a 'one off'."

This project covered skills in design, storyboarding and planning, sequencing, scripting, rehearsal, recording, reviewing, editing and testing, video editing in iMovie and peer to peer work.
