St Mary's 50th Year Celebrations

This academic year marks the 50th year on the site as our school was built in 1967. To mark the occasion, events have been planned each term. The week beginning the 20th November marks the 50th day this term and we will begin the week giving our pupils a taste of what school was like in the 1960's. On Wednesday 22nd, we will celebrate with a whole school Mass to which past staff and governors have been invited and will enjoy lunch afterwards. On Friday 24th the children will be sharing their learning during a special assembly where we will collectively create a timeline of key events from the 1960's to the present day. Mrs. Slater will be making a birthday cake which all the children will be able to share after the assembly.

Parent Consultation Meetings

On the 29th November and the 5th December Parent Consultations Meetings will take place and you will have the opportunity to speak to your child/rens class teacher and view their work in their classrooms. I hope you will take up this opportunity to discuss and see their progress to date and also to be informed of their next steps.

Blooming Great News!

Every year, the children of Class 4 carry out various gardening projects in conjunction with Falmouth Town Council and Cormac. In the Autumn Term, they clear the beds in Queen Mary Gardens and plant daffodils in Arwenack Avenue before returning to plant up the gardens at the end of Spring. They also take part in various charitable projects, the last one being planting hundreds of crocus bulbs for the Rotary Club's 'End Polio Now!' campaign.

Well, last year's Year 4, together with St Mary's Gardening Club received special recognition for all of their hard work in the community and for making Falmouth a beautiful town. As a result, the school has been given a Level 5 (Outstanding) Award by the judges of the South West in Bloom competition.

Falmouth has now been invited to enter the Britain in Bloom Competition for this year and the current Class 4 has already made an impressive start to the gardening year! Let's hope for a national award next year!



Anti-Bullying Week

National Anti-Bullying week runs from 13th to 17th November. The theme is 'All different, All equal' and aims to promote difference and equality. It will help the children to celebrate what makes them and others unique and help them to understand why it's important that every child feels included.

During the week the school council will be creating a film outlining how we deal with bullying in our school. They will be hosting a video-booth during the lunchtime where children will be able to come along and share their top tips about how to overcome any bullying. When complete the video will be shared on the school website. The school council will also be selling blue anti-bullying wristbands at a cost of £1. Each lunchtime there will be an opportunity for children to share their ideas about how we are all special by creating 'helping hands' with pictures and writing celebrating their uniqueness.

As part of our celebration of difference we will be holding an 'odd socks day' on Friday 17th November. We will be encouraging the children to come to school with odd socks to show that we are all different but all special.

Online Safety

During Anti-Bullying week the children will have the opportunity to discuss how to overcome bullying both in real-life and online. Keeping up to date with the way our children are using technology is an ongoing challenge. To support you with helping your child to stay safe online Miss Buscombe, our e-safety co-ordinator will be holding a drop-in session from 3.30-5.00pm in the Reception Class to answer any individual questions or concerns regarding online safety. Our annual e-safety information meeting for parents will take place later in the year.
