Focus Subject: Geography

Key Vocabulary:

Geography

As geographers, we will:

Learn about how geographers measure population numbers and how data about populations can tell us important information about the past, present and future. We will learn how to use specific data formats such as population pyramids and think about the variables that can affect population growth and decrease.

As mathematicians, we will:

This half term we will finish our Unit on the Four Operations by looking at long division. We will then move to the order of operations and how to solve questions efficiently and mentally.

We will then complete two Units on Fractions which will cover addition, subtraction, multiplication and division of fractions. We will finish the half term by looking at measurement.

We will also continue with our fluency and arithmetic skills with our daily 5-in-5 and a weekly arithmetic auiz.

As scientists, we will:

We will explore the basics of electricity and how it flows through circuits. We'll learn about key components, like batteries, bulbs, wires, and switches, and see how these parts work together in complete and incomplete circuits. We'll investigate how adding or removing components affects the circuit and experiment with series and parallel circuits. By the end of the unit, we'll know how to create simple circuits and apply this knowledge to solve real-world problems.
